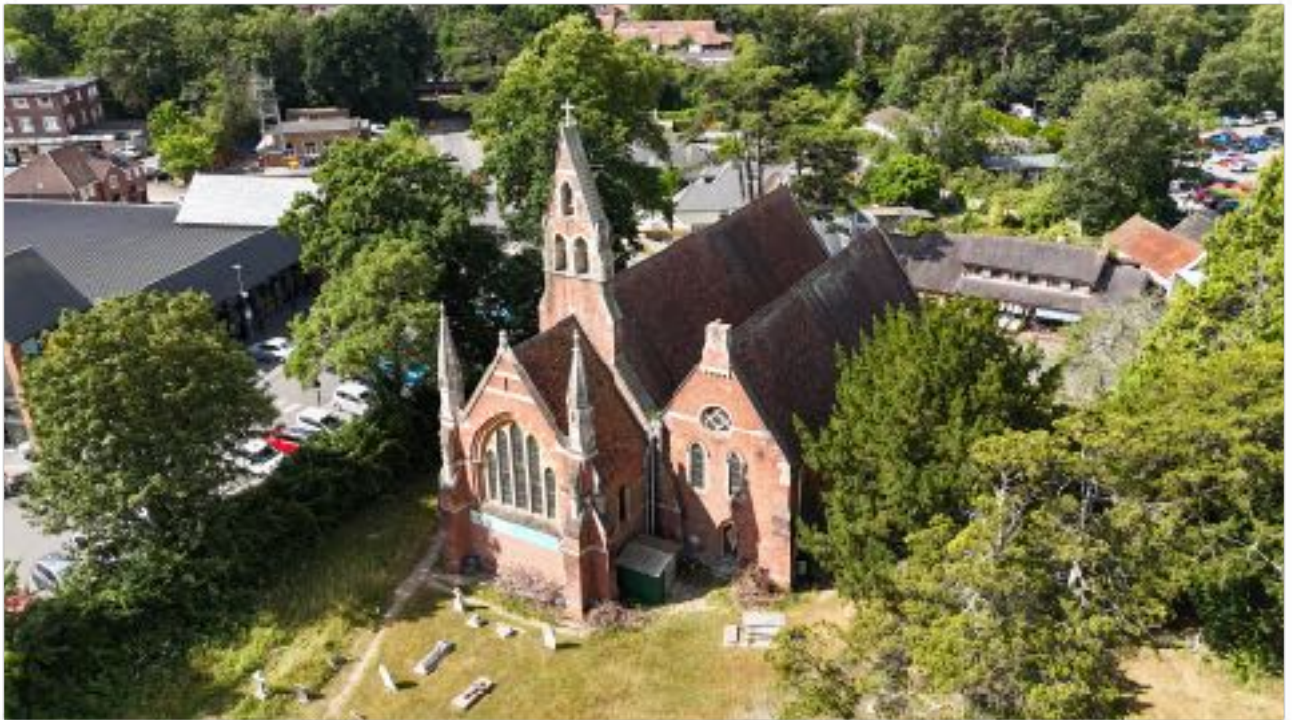

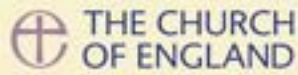

The origins

Created to help you develop a deeper, daily connection with God.

Inspired by the ancient practice of Lectio Divina, daily devotionals guide users to pray the Bible through Scripture, reflection, and prayer each morning, midday and evening.

Since launching in 2019, Lectio 365 has helped thousands of people make prayer a regular, life-giving habit – wherever they are and whatever their day holds.

The first one is **Lectio365**, which is a free daily prayer app from 247-Prayer; with morning, midday & night devotionals to help you experience God's presence in your life. For more information and links to download, visit [www.lectio364.com](http://www.lectio364.com) There's even a Lectio for families with accessible reflections.

## **P.R.A.Y.**

Lectio 365 prayers are inspired by the ancient practice of Lectio Divina (which means 'Divine Reading'), a way of meditating on the Bible that's been used by Christians for centuries.

**P**ause, breathe deeply, and be still in God's presence

**R**ejoice with a Psalm and reflect on Scripture

**A**sk God to help you and those you care about

**Y**ield to God; welcome his love, his plans and his presence into your day.

On Sundays, we take a break from the normal routine to pray a different kind of Sabbath prayer.

The app celebrates heroes of faith on Feast Days, marks significant moments in the church calendar, and welcomes guest hosts throughout the year.

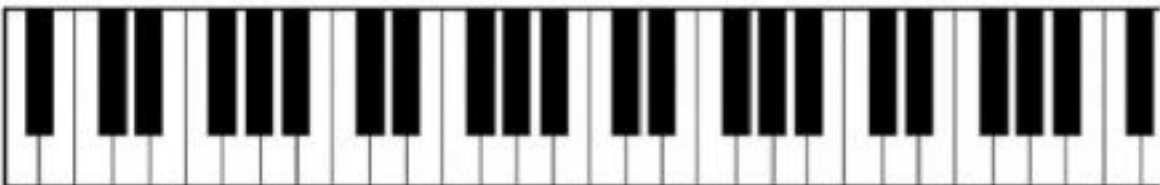

# TESTIMONIES

## Bubble Church

Before my younger son arrived, I longed to bring my boys to church, to help them know God in a welcoming, child-friendly space. My older son's autism made me hesitate; many Sunday schools separate families, but he needs me near, and pregnancy added to the challenge. I waited until my younger son was two months old. However, from our first Bubble Church Sunday at St John's, we found profound belonging.

Bubble Church has become our extended family, embracing us with no judgment, only gentle acceptance. Stewards offer constant support, reminding me help is always there. My older son can be fully himself here: his stims welcomed, noise-cancelling headphones provided, no masking required... not to mention the repeated visits to the croissant table! This is his one place beyond home where he feels truly free. My younger son has grown up here, simply allowed to be a child.

Lee's leadership has been the gentle, radiant heart of this welcome. His Christ-like warmth shines through in every interaction, never rushed, always attentive. He gently persisted, inviting me more than once to stay for the full service after Bubble Church, reassuring me with quiet conviction that children are made in God's image and are welcome exactly as they are. His words carried God's truth,

and when I finally trusted them and stayed, I saw the whole congregation reflect that same unconditional acceptance.

Worship songs now fill our home daily; my older son replays puppet stories and actions when calm. The “sorry song” grounds us in confession and thanks. Motherhood’s challenges, especially additional needs, I have admittedly found hard! But at St John’s they have been met with grace, anchoring me in God’s view, not society’s. Psalm 127:3 reminds me: “Children are a heritage from the Lord, offspring a reward from him.” My boys are His gifts; we belong in His family, no matter the struggles.

Bubble Church has brought us home, a sacred reminder we are God’s beloved children, always welcomed. Without Lee’s patient encouragement, his overflowing love, and his unwavering commitment to inclusion, I might never have found the courage to deepen my faith, to keep returning week after week, and ultimately to be confirmed.

Lee, thank you for leading with such humility and compassion. You have made St John’s a true haven for families like ours, modeling Christ’s love in ways that will echo long after you leave. May God bless your next chapter richly, you depart leaving an indelible legacy of grace

## **Holy Communion at St. John's**

It can start with coffee or tea and a chance to socialize with people leaving the earlier services, as well as with those arriving for Holy Communion. There is a choice of staying at the tables or moving over to the pews before the service begins.

Everything is well-organized (apart from the occasional misbehaviour of the overhead screens!) and there is maximum involvement of the congregation in singing responses and hymns and reading lessons and prayers. The atmosphere for worship is achieved by the many candles glittering around the altar, the stained glass,

especially the east window showing the baby Jesus and Christ crucified, seasonal flower arrangements and decorations and by the organ and choir.

Sometimes the choir sings a particularly beautiful piece as we receive communion at the altar, which can be both uplifting and emotional.

We are fortunate to have such good preachers and there is always valuable teaching to be had from the sermon - things are said that are truly meant.

One leaves the service uplifted and better able to face the coming week - well done to all concerned!

## **Morning worship**

During the lowest point in our lives, struggling with overwhelming grief, we found our selves drawn one Sunday, to the church where we had said our final goodbyes to our mum in November 2024.

The 1015 am morning worship with its upbeat music, relaxed service and easy to understand bible stories quickly became an important place for us, a place of real comfort and healing.

From the very beginning we were overwhelmed by the sense of belonging we felt at this wonderful service and for the kindness and words of support from the congregation we were lucky enough to receive, from people we didn't know.

Since then we are enjoying the journey of exploring our faith and are truly cherishing being part of the St John's family.

Dear Beloved Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As you are all now painfully aware, in the early hours of this morning, February 28<sup>th</sup>, a coordinated and massive military assault was launched by the United States and Israel against numerous cities and installations within Iran. This operation, described by the leaders of the two nations as a “pre-emptive” attack, has brought fire and destruction to the heart of Tehran, Isfahan, and beyond, striking at the very centers of governance and civilian life. Moreover, just prior to these events, Israel had also “pre-emptively” attacked various targets in southern Lebanon, where the number of casualties has yet to be determined.

Tragically, the cycle of violence has expanded with terrifying speed. In the hours following, Iran launched a widespread reprisal, with missiles and drones targeting Israel and U.S. military assets across the Gulf—striking installations in Kuwait, Bahrain, the United Arab Emirates, Kurdistan-Iraq, Jordan, and Qatar. Sirens also blared across the Holy Land, warning of incoming missiles from Iran. Suddenly, our people from the Mediterranean to the Persian Gulf find themselves once again huddled in shelters, fearing for their lives as the shadow of a total regional war looms over us.

These developments strike at the very soul of our Province of Jerusalem & the Middle East. Every single nation now engaged in this combat, and those bearing the brunt of the retaliatory strikes, resides within our ecclesiastical boundaries. Our brothers and sisters in the Diocese of Iran are currently enduring the terror of aerial bombardment; our members in the Diocese of Cyprus & the Gulf are witnessing the arrival of war at their doorsteps; and our faithful in the Diocese of Jerusalem—extending across Israel, Palestine, Jordan, Lebanon, and Syria—face an unprecedented threat of military escalation.

In the face of such overwhelming force, we recall the words of our Lord Jesus Christ: “Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God” (Matt 5:9). Today, that calling feels heavier than ever before. When the “spirit of fear” threatens to consume our hearts, we must anchor ourselves in the “spirit of power, and of love, and of a sound mind” (2 Tim 1:7).

First, I call upon the global Church to join us in urgent, unceasing prayer. We implore God to protect the innocent—the mothers, the children, and the elderly—who are caught in the crossfire of this “Operation Epic Fury” and the subsequent “crushing responses.” We pray specifically for a “sound mind” for the leaders of the United States, Israel, and Iran, that they might recognize the futility of this bloodshed and turn back from the precipice of a global catastrophe.

Second, we must offer each other the sanctuary of Christian love. I therefore urge our clergy and laity to be beacons of comfort. In a time of “regime change” rhetoric and military ultimatums, let our message be the unchanging promise of Christ’s peace: to build each other up (1 Cor 8:1), for our hope is not in the strength of armadas or missile shields, but in the Prince of Peace.

Finally, we must remain “Bridge Builders.” Even as diplomatic windows seem to slam shut, the Church must keep the doors of reconciliation open. We refuse to see our neighbors as enemies, whether they be in Tehran, Tel Aviv, or the military bases of the Gulf. I extend an urgent invitation to the wider Anglican Communion and all people of goodwill: Intercede for us now. The hour is late, and the danger is great. We remain “battered and bruised, but not defeated.” May the peace of God, which passes all understanding, guard our hearts and minds in Christ Jesus.

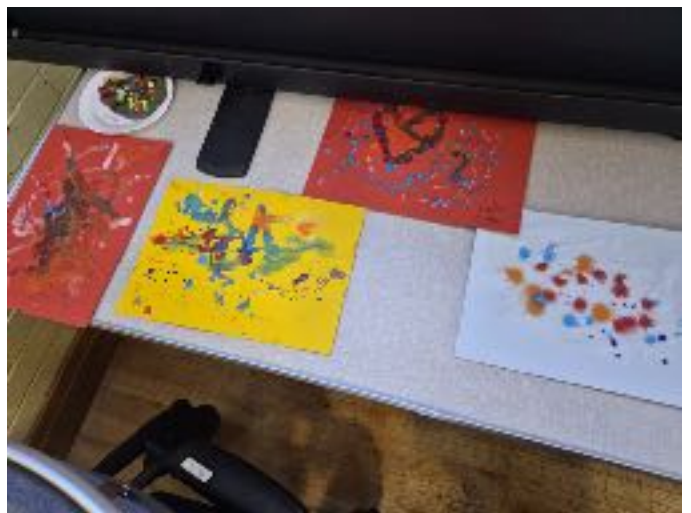

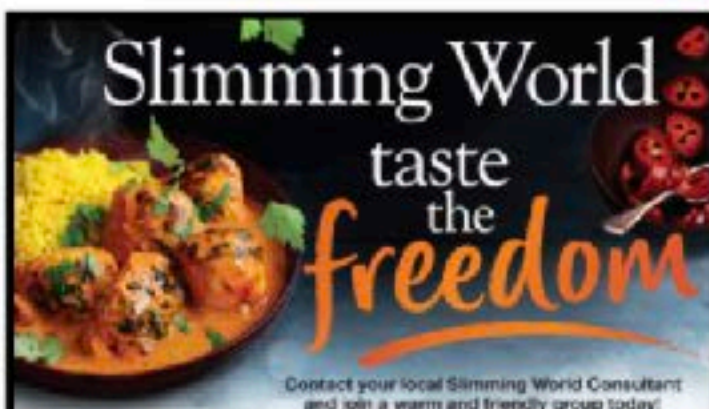

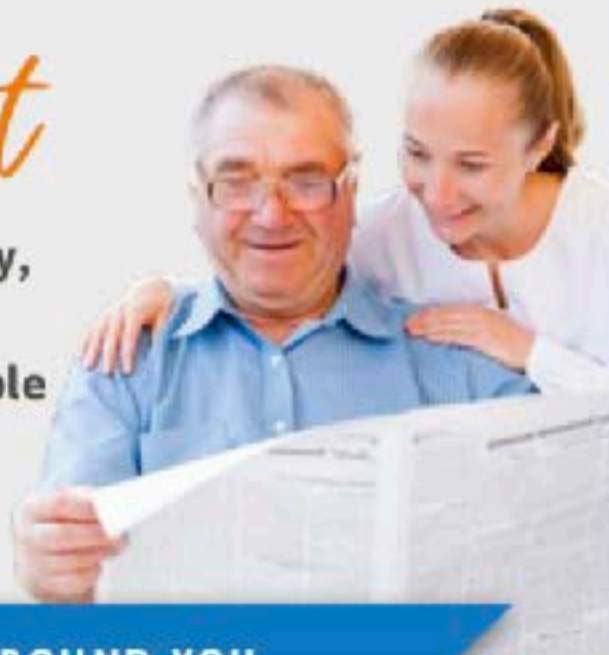
