


VICARS LETTER

The Church of England's Advent and Christmas theme for 2025 revolves round a single word: Joy!

Our churches and cathedrals will - as always - be seeking to make the most of the opportunity December brings to share The Joy of Christmas with their communities.



The great joy of Christmas, of course, is the good news the angel declared to the shepherds - the news of Jesus' birth as Emmanuel (God With Us).

To help congregations to prepare for the joy of Christmas, we have a unique Advent resource exploring the symbolism behind the hymn 'O Come Emmanuel'.

With daily reflections by Jane Williams, Chris Russell, Esther Prior, Philip North, Muthuraj Swamy, Tanya Marlow and David Hoyle. The reflections will appear on the Everyday Faith app (available from the app store, or Church of England Website) from 1 to 24 December, accompanied by a range of online music, artwork and creative suggestions for local use.

For more than a thousand years, Christians have prepared for the nativity of Christ with the Advent Antiphons – an ancient and rich tapestry of biblical titles for Christ – on which the much-loved hymn O Come, O Come Emmanuel is based.

A THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK FROM +RHIANNON

As we approach Safeguarding Sunday (November 16th) in our churches I'd like to share with you a beautiful prayer by the wonderful poet, Gerard Kelly. It is a prayer I'm praying over all those that read this. It describes a sense of deep safety in God which He intends for all and which we, his servants, are called to foster everywhere.

In the centre of your storm may you discover what it is to be still; still loved still known still held still at peace, though the pieces fall around you. When you feel at your most powerless may his presence fall like tears. May it settle all around you. May it soften and surround you, his comfort a cocoon for you, his pulse the pace you hold to, his breath the only sound vou need to hear. When the harshest howl of pain you've ever known

erupts within you, may it meet the gentle strength of his embrace. May you know when fear enfolds you that he holds you. May you sense when darkness falls he sees it all. On the toughest trail you've travelled may you taste the abundance of his beauty, the wideness of his mercy, the true and tender tone of his great love.



SPOTLIGHT ON EMILY: BCM & TRAINEE BPP!

My name is Emily, I'm a children's nurse, and I'm married to our

lovely vicar, Lee. We've been married for almost 30 years and have 4 adult children, a daughter in law and a brand new granddaughter. Along with our Romanian rescue dog and 2 guinea pigs all eight of us live in the vicarage- it's a good job it's a big house!

I grew up in Stevenage in a Christian family and some of my earliest memories include attending an Anglican church with my Grandma (who played the organ) as well regularly going to the Quaker Meeting House with my parents.

Although Christianity has been a part of my life



through my upbringing, it wasn't until Saltmine Trust came to do a schools mission in my town in 1990 that I realised there is more to faith than attending church every week and just knowing about Jesus. Since then I have actively sought to be a disciple of Jesus through personal prayer, reading my bible and inviting Him to be part of my day to day life.

My journey as a Christian has taken me on some interesting adventures all over the world but it is in the ordinary, mundaneness of life that I find my faith has grown the most.

In 2018 I completed the Bishop's Commission for Mission training in Worship. I had already been involved in leading worship for many years, from being in the choir, in the worship band, leading the prayers or being the service leader. The BCM training gave me so much more knowledge, skills and resources to equip me for the role I was playing in church.

In St John's I use these skills as part of the wonderful Bubble Church team. I especially love leading the services as it is such a joy to see all the young families having fun as they worship God and grow in their faith.

When Lee introduced the new service patterns last year, this made room for a new contemporary service to begin. I was really excited to be able to use my creative skills to re-imagine a church service and help make faith more accessible to new people. I remember saying to Lee 'I'll come up with the ideas around the bible reading and you can do the talk.' I saw it as 'playing to our strengths.'

However, as is often the way, God had other plans! Sadly Lee became ill and had to take several months off work. In his absence many of us in the congregation took a step up. For me this meant reluctantly agreeing to lead the 10:15 service without Lee and doing the talk as well.

I have always said that I am not a preacher, or someone who delivers sermons and so it wasn't until August 2024, when I led the 10:15 service that I preached for the first time. I felt so far out of my comfort zone! I still do every time I do the talk. But at the same time I feel a peace, God's peace that passes all understanding. A pastor of ours many years ago said 'God doesn't call the equipped, he equips the called.'

I am currently doing the Bishop's Permission to Preach (BPP) training, and look forward to learning more as I engage with this training.

Maybe God is calling you to 'step outside your comfort zone' and give something a try? Why not attend a BCM taster evening at the Diocese or speak to Lee, who will gently encourage and give you opportunities to explore further? *Emily*



We are thrilled to have baptised children from two Bubble Church families, this year and have more children and adults coming forward for Baptism & Confirmation who are part of our fellowship.


Good News Family Bible - We have presented bibles to these families and will be offering them a chance to join together and explore them as a family with other families.






